# A BRIEF HISTORY OF CARRICK RANGERS FC

Carrick Rangers was formed in 1939, initially playing in a local summer league. The following year entry to the Minor League was approved, and a first title earned in the 1941/42 season. The step up to the Amateur League was a natural progression, and further honours arrived – two Amateur League titles and a McKelvie Cup.

It wasn't too long before the 'B' Division beckoned, and in the 1960's Carrick became something of a cup specialist with two Steel & Sons victories to go along with two Louis Moore triumphs. A League title win was also secured in 1961/62.

Carrick's halcyon period, however, was between 1972 and 1977: three 'B' Division titles, two Intermediate Cup victories, an Irish Cup win and four matches with Europe's finest in the European Cup Winners Cup, reaching the last-16 stage before losing to Southampton.

Another 'B' Division title arrived in 1983, and at the end of that season Carrick Rangers were elected to the Senior Irish League (there was no automatic promotion back then – clubs had to apply to enter that league each year and hope the existing Senior Clubs would look favourably on the request!)

Top flight football was a perennial struggle, however, with Rangers more often than not finishing at the foot of the League table. Two Irish Cup final losses (1984 and 1995) and a County Antrim Shield win in 1993 were the only highlights before a re-organisation of the League structure saw the club demoted to a new First Division in 1995.

The drop to the second tier was a lengthy and largely uneventful one, with only a Daily Mirror Cup win achieved in 2003/04 and a losing appearance in the 2008 Steel & Sons Cup Final to show for their efforts.

Fortunes changed when former player Michael Hughes returned to the club in 2010, following a very successful professional and International career, taking ownership of the club as a majority shareholder.


His involvement provided the backing that resulted in promotion being secured to the Premier League at the end of that season, courtesy of winning the Championship 1 title, and also landing the Intermediate Cup. The long awaited return was short lived, with the club relegated at the first time of asking.

In 2014/15, Carrick Rangers embarked on a remarkable campaign which culminated in another Championship 1 title, and both the Steel & Sons Cup and Intermediate Cup to complete a historic treble. That Championship 1 success also secured promotion to the Danske Bank Premiership.

It was to be a difficult time on the field, though, as the club flirted with relegation in each of the three following seasons, narrowly avoiding the drop on two occasions.

There was a temporary respite from struggles in the Premiership as Carrick reached the League Cup Final. However, the almost inevitable relegation was confirmed the following season as Carrick lost a promotion/relegation play off with Newry City.

Life back in the Championship was expected to be a time to rebuild. Early season results suggested there would be little success heading the clubs way. However, under the stewardship of new manager Niall Currie, Carrick put in a very strong finish to the campaign which secured a play-off with Ards. The resultant wins in both legs took Rangers back to the top flight at the first time of asking.

# FIRST TEAM MANAGER: NIALL CURRIE

Niall Currie was appointed as Manager of Carrick Rangers on Thursday 24th May 2018.

Currie's management career started at Annagh United where, in the 2006-07 season, he guided Annagh to the semi-final of both the Bob Radcliffe Cup and the Intermediate Cup, as well as the final of the Mid-Ulster Cup before moving on to Loughgall where, in his first season at the club, he delivered a clean sweep of five trophies as the Villagers won the Championship along with the Carnegie League Cup, Bob Radcliffe Cup, Mid-Ulster Cup and Intermediate Cup.

The former Irish League goalkeeper's next role would see him appointed as Ards boss in October 2011, as he won two Championship titles at the North Down side before taking up the reigns at his hometown club Portadown, eventually parting ways in February 2018.

Coming on board as 'Gers gaffer following the side's relegation from the Premiership, Currie worked wonders in his first season to take a new squad of players and finish second in the Championship, going on to win three play-off games in six days to secure a return to the Premiership at the first time of asking.



# GETTING TO THE LOUGHSHORE HOTEL ARENA BY CAR...

### **POSTCODE**

Using your SatNav to get to the Loughshore Hotel Arena? Our postcode is BT38 7HF

### **PARKING**

Car parking is available within Castle Practice which is located directly opposite the ground. Limited car parking is also available outside the ground.

#### **FROM BELFAST**

Follow the A2 from Newtownabbey and Greenisland. Once in Carrickfergus continue past the castle and town centre then after half a mile take a left turn into Taylors Avenue, follow the horseshoe bridge over the railway line and the ground is directly in front of you.

### **FROM LARNE**

Follow the A2 from Larne and Whitehead towards Carrickfergus. Go through Eden Village and about half a mile before the castle in the distance on your left, turn right into Taylors Avenue. Follow the horseshoe bridge over the railway line and the ground is directly in front of you.

# GETTING TO THE LOUGHSHORE HOTEL ARENA BY TRAIN...

### **STATION**

The nearest station to the stadium is Downshire Halt, which is located just over half a mile away. It is served by trains on the Belfast/Larne line.

### **TIMETABLES**

Timetables for up to date departures and arrivals from the train station are available on the Translink website. Please note Translink run a Saturday service with different schedules to those midweek.

### **DIRECTIONS**

Downshire Halt is around a ten minute walk from the stadium. As you exit the station, turn left along the Marine Highway.

Take the second right, where you will see Hazel's Newsagents on the corner, onto Taylors Avenue. Follow the road up and over the foot bridge over the railway and you will see the ground immediately over to your left.

### BY BUS...

### **STOPS**

The nearest bus stop to the stadium is Joymount, which is located just over half a mile away. It is served by multiple routes that pass through the Carrickfergus area.


### **TIMETABLES**

Timetables for all routes that stop at Joymount are available on the Translink website. Please note Translink run a Saturday service with different schedules to those midweek.


### **DIRECTIONS**

Joymount stop is around a ten minute walk from the stadium. From Joymount stop, walk along Joymount heading away from the Town Centre. Carry on straight at the roundabout, on Scotch Quarter.

Take the first left, where you will see Hazel's Newsagents on the corner, onto Taylors Avenue. Follow the road up and over the foot bridge over the railway and you will see the ground immediately over to your left.



## **MATCHDAY ADMISSION**

### **TICKETS**

Entrance to the Loughshore Hotel Arena is pay at the turnstiles, by cash only.

On the rare occasion that a match is deemed ALL TICKET, tickets will be available from multiple locations around the town. These locations will be frequently announced and updated on our website and social media.

### **PRICES**

Adults: £12

Concession: £8

(Prices may vary for Cup games)

### WHEELCHAIR ACCESS

Designated wheelchair spaces are in place in front of the main stand and also under the covered terracing at the far side of the ground. Disabled parking spaces are available at Carrickfergus Health Centre



## **SEASON TICKETS**

With the increased NIFL matchday prices of £12 for adult entry, our season tickets represent even greater value than ever!
Season ticket holders will also be entitled to 15% off all food orders in the Loughshore Hotel, Chimney Corner and Ten Square Hotel.

Adult season tickets will cost £150, which represents a saving of £59 over the 19 home league games.

Concession (OAP/Student) tickets will cost £85, which represents a massive saving of £48.

Under 11 tickets will be a mere £20, which means that each game will cost just over £1 each.

Cold drinks, tea, coffee and snacks are also available at our Club Shop!





# FAQ'S

### How much is admission to the games?

Admission for league games is £12 for adults and £8 for concessions. Prices vary for cup games.

### Where should I watch the game from?

Generally games are unsegregated, so fans are able to watch the game from anywhere in the ground. This may be from the seated stand, the stand behind the goal, terracing or standing behind the perimeter wall.

### Where can the toilets in the ground be found?

Toilets can be found at either side of the ground - on the right hand side after entering the turnstiles, and at the far of the changing rooms at the far side of the ground.

### Is there a bar in the ground?

There isn't a bar in the ground, however the Royal Oak bar can be found in walking distance from the ground; from the ground, turn right and walk over the footbridge. Then turn left, where you will find the Royal Oak further up the road, just before the Police Station.

# FAQ'S

### Can merchandise be purchased at the ground?

Some merchandise such as hats, scarves and air fresheners can be purchased at the ground at our Club Shop, however the vast majority can be purchased online via our Club Sport NI club shop.

### Is there food and drinks available at the ground?

Food and drink is available courtesy of LJ's Catering and our Club Shop. LJ's can be found at the left hand side of the ground upon entering and serves hot food. The Club Shop can be found at the far side of the ground which serves hot and cold drinks as well as snacks.

### Where can I park at the ground?

Parking is available within Carrickfergus Health Centre opposite the ground.

### Can I pay by card?

Unfortunately turnstiles and catering facilities are unable to facilitate card payments and are cash only.
